Tradition 3 Workshop:

(Full Document Sent by Secretary on 1/06/14 Re: MWR: January 3, 2015 GSR Conference Call) The relatives of addicts, when gathered for mutual aid, may call themselves a Nar-Anon Family Group, provided that as a group, they have no other affiliation. The only requirement for membership is that there be a problem of addiction in a relative or friend.

- Questions:
 - What does your group do to encourage sharing? Do you ever change it up?
 - (Shawnee KS) We try to be very welcoming and pull them aside and give them a quick review of what to expect in the meeting. We encourage sharing in several ways:
 - 1. Open floor for topic
 - 2. Use today's page in SESH book for topic
 - 3. Can always speak on an off-topic subject if it is on your heart
 - 4. Stick meetings (pick a topic out of a jar- this prevents people from thinking ahead on what they are going to say)
 - 5. Group Conscience meetings (we have a pot luck to encourage participation)
 - (Rockford IL Tuesday) We do step meetings. We try to encourage members to keep coming back, we have not changed things up too much.
 - What does your group do to discourage cross talk and advise giving, why?
 - (Elmhurst) Reads Guidelines for Healthy Meetings as a reminder

- (Shawnee KS) Our group's biggest struggle in when one person is sharing for too long, the group tries to
 help move things along so that everyone gets a chance to share. Is open to suggestions for how to handle
 that
- (Elmhurst) When their group has someone sharing for a long time, it tends to be a newcomer or someone in distress, because they also don't know how to deal with it, they just all silently agree that they must need it. Sometimes people meet after the meeting so that people can have additional support if people need more sharing time.
- (Maryland Heights MO) They read in the opening the suggested sharing time and that we do not engage in cross talk. They also encourage people that we can talk more after the meeting or use the call list. They let people go as long as they need to, especially if they are having a difficult time, others just try to be patient.
- (Alternate Delegate) Has been at meetings where newcomers have been cut off and they have not returned.
 People may feel rejected or ashamed when they are cut short. Meetings need to be a safe place to share openly.
- How do you personally keep the focus on yourself when sharing? Why?
 - (Delegate) Learned early on that this program is about ME. In the beginning I shared about my addict, but someone once said we don't need to share our war storied, we all have them. This helps me remember to keep the focus on myself and what I am going through and not talking about my addict. We learn by hearing about what they are going through, how they got through it, and how they are doing now. Focusing on the addict does not help me grow.
 - (Elmhurst IL) Felt the Delegate's report at the Annual Assembly helped them so much. Now thinks about
 what they are doing in recovery. Writes down so they can look back and see how they have been doing.
 - (Shawnee KS) Liked Elmhurst's share on this question
- o How does your group welcome the newcomer?
 - Facilitator felt we have already discussed newcomers and moved onto final question
- How does your group keep the program spiritual not affiliated with any specific religion or organization?
 - (Shawnee KS) Religion does not come up as an issue. Some have a very strong Christian belief but others
 have entirely different beliefs and they are all respected.
