Family

Tradition One can be relevant in our families and our homes, and begins with our care and concern for the common welfare of the family. When we make decisions, we must consider the family as a whole. Personal progress for each depends on unity.*

Study Question as it pertains to Family: How can I change the way I communicate to be considerate of other family members?*

Service

Service creates a feeling of belonging and a sense of worth. It requires a commitment to our common welfare and our personal progress. Member participation is needed to steer the ship of recovery for us all. When we are elected to hold a service position, we are trusted to honor the Twelve Traditions and Twelve Concepts of Nar-Anon.*
